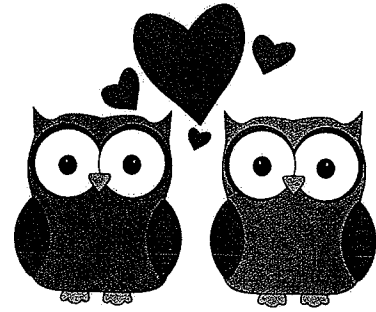

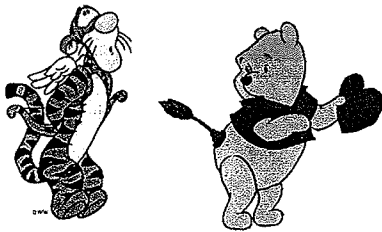

Black History Program By Ian Shear

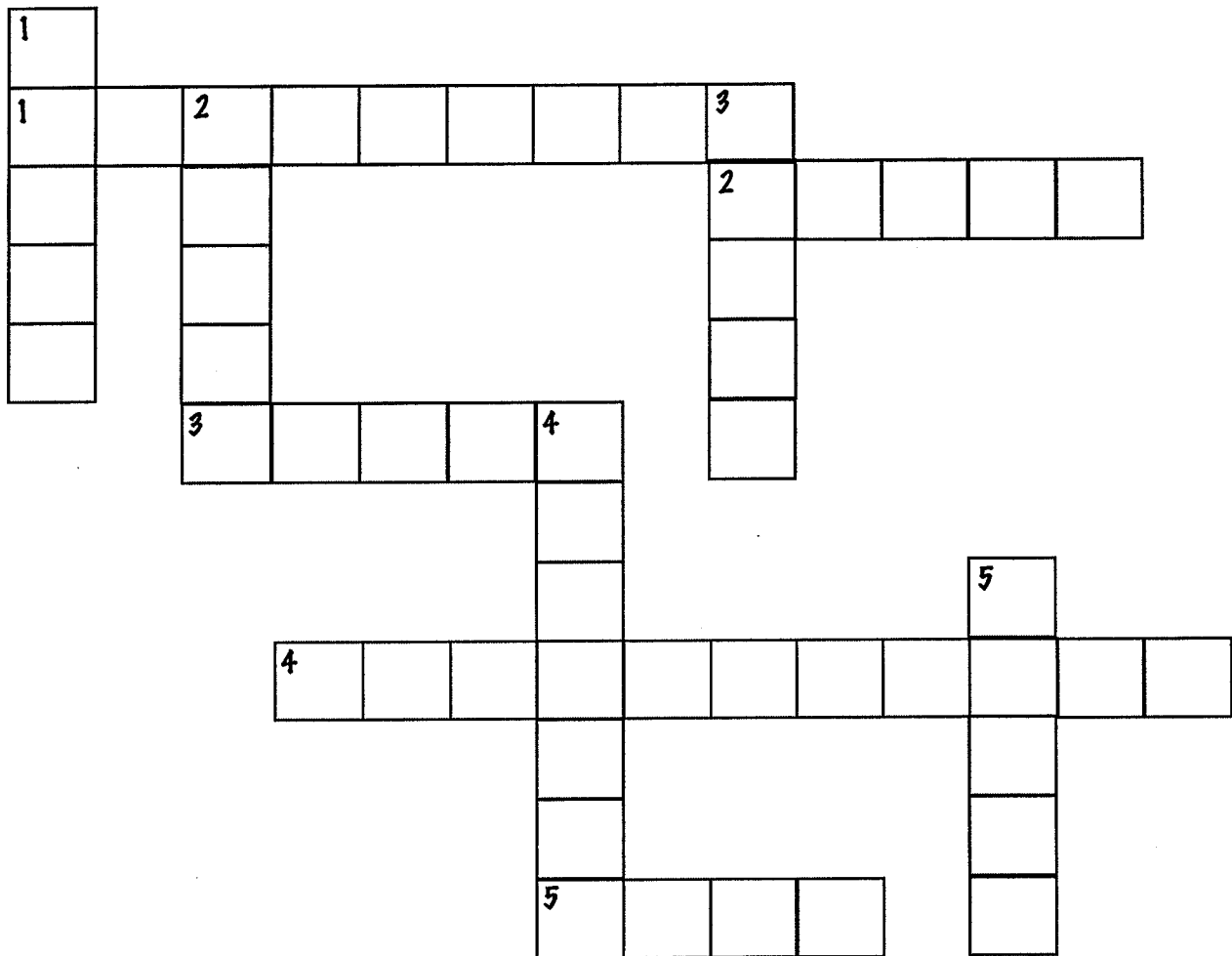

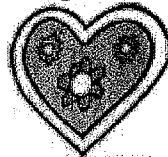

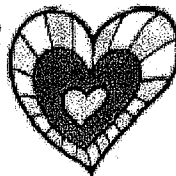
