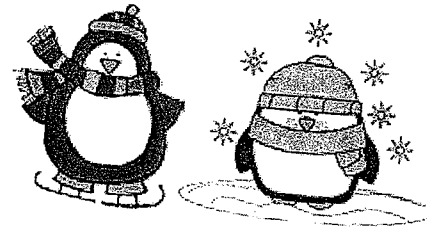

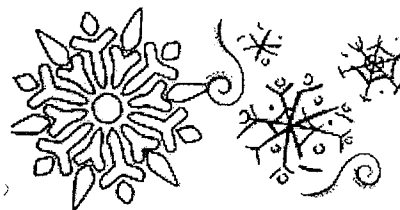
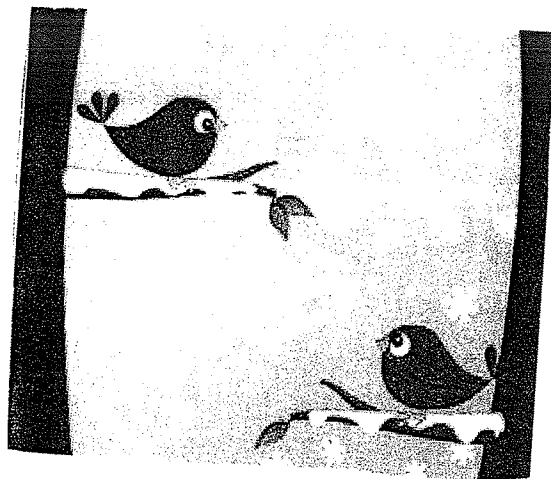


Advisory Concerns By Zhoe Shipler

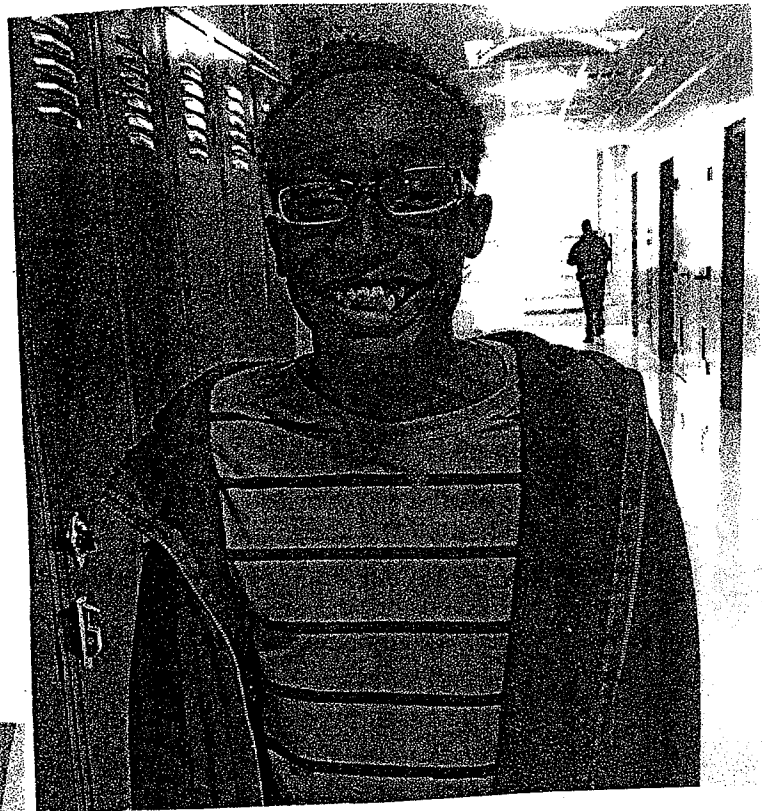
Ms. Paulmbo's Advisory By Astazia Clark

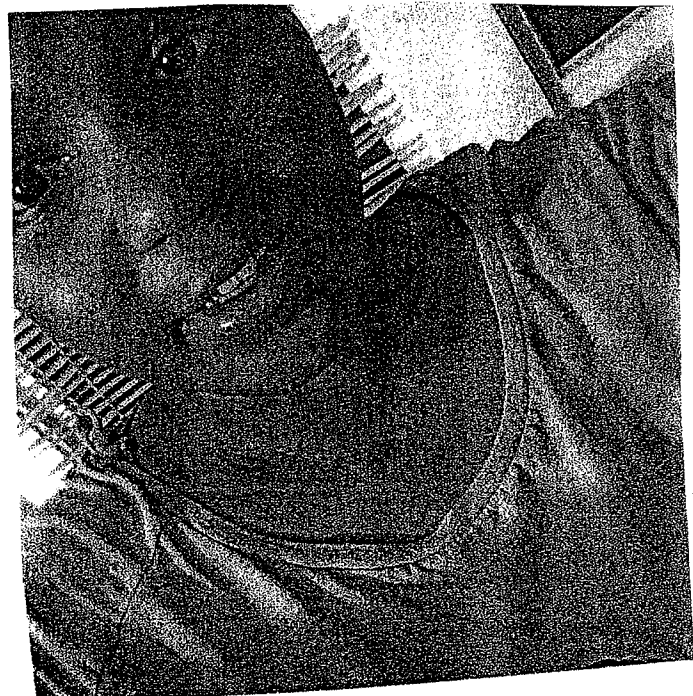
Mrs. Watson's Advisory By Astazia Clark

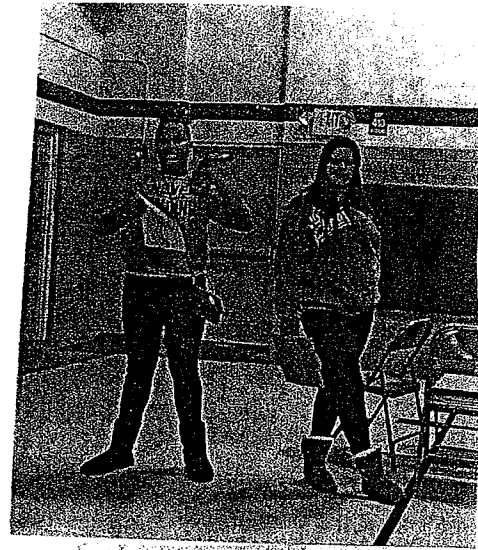
Mr. LaMaster's Advisory By Astazia Clark

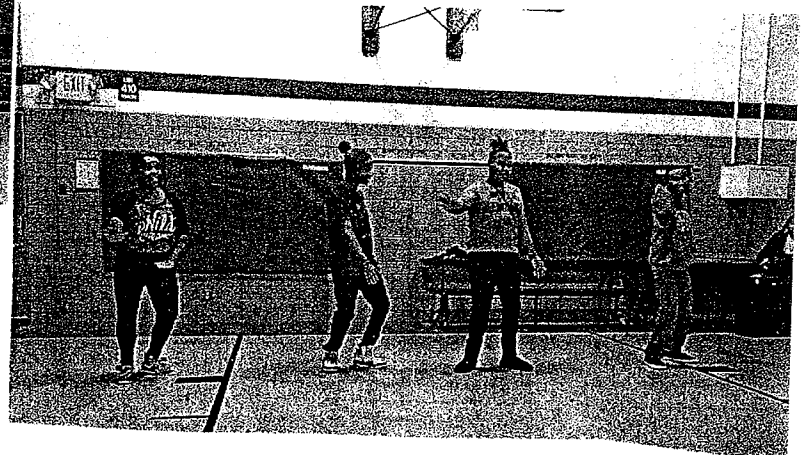
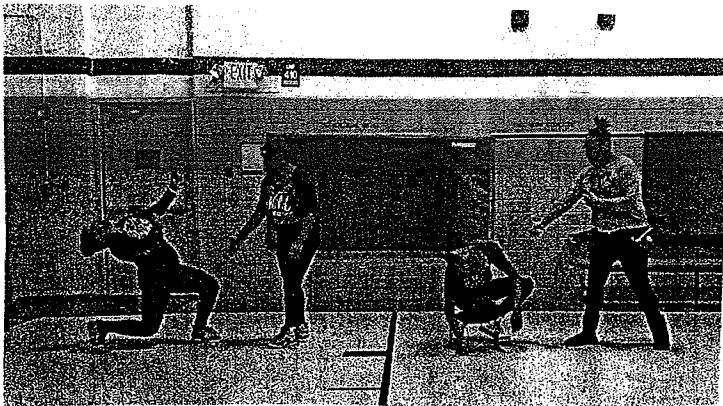
Student of the Month By Justin Devlin

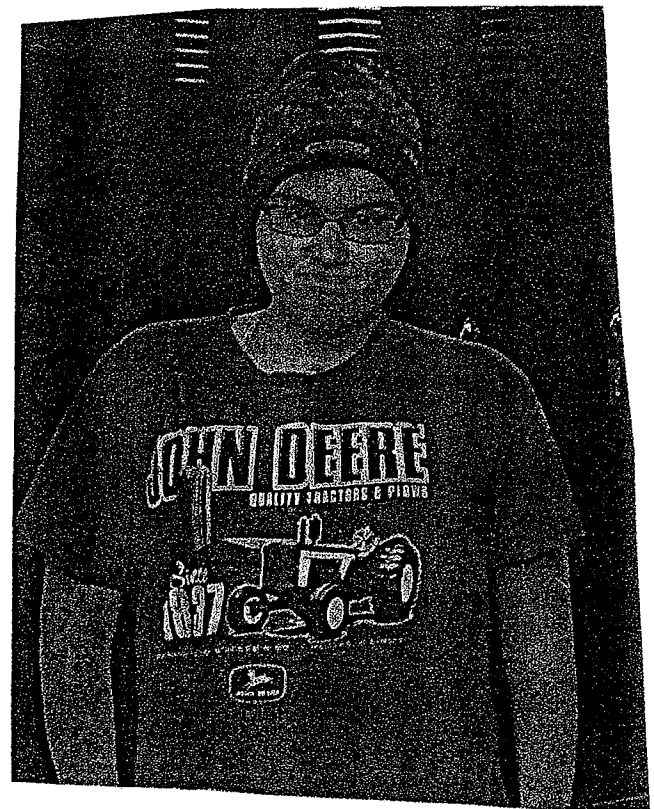
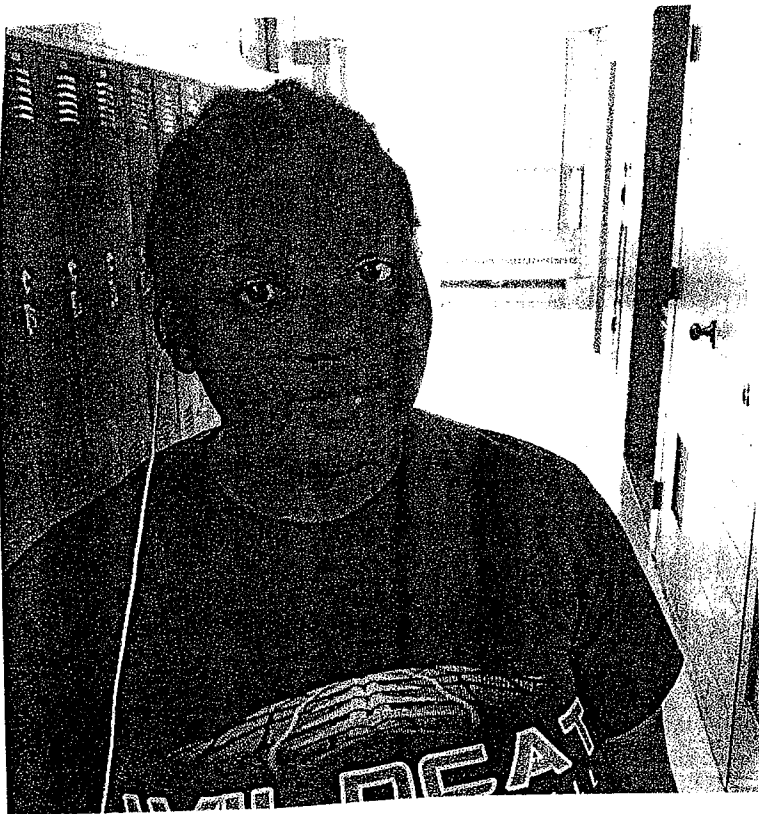
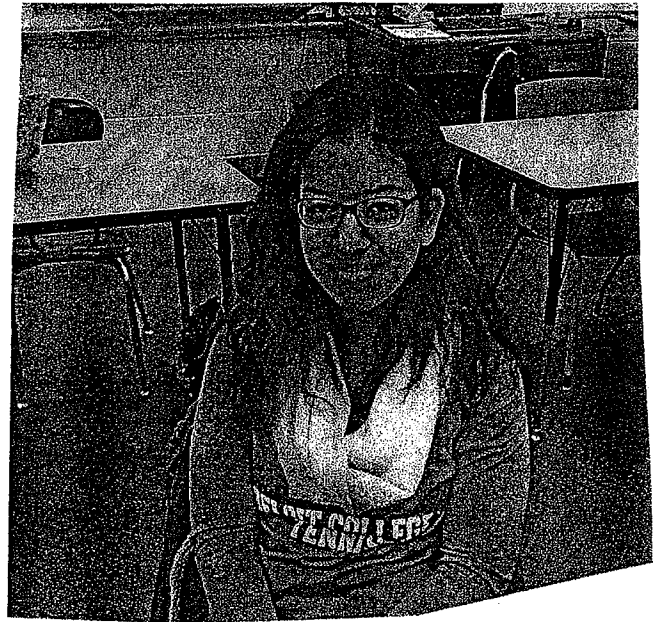
Dance By De'Marco Randolph

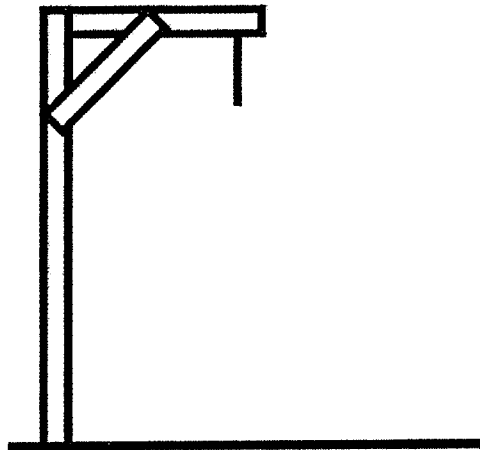

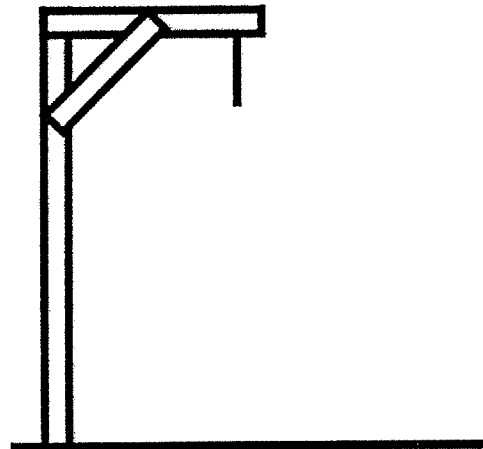
- 10 inches of snow equals one inch of liquid rain

- Snow appears to come in a variety of colors, yellow, orange, green and even purple. Actually, it's colorless but it can contain dust or algae that give it different colors.



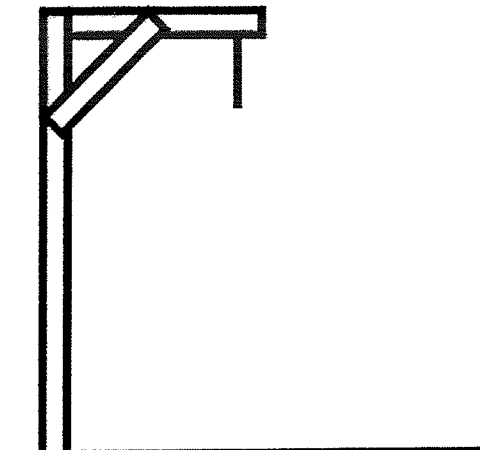




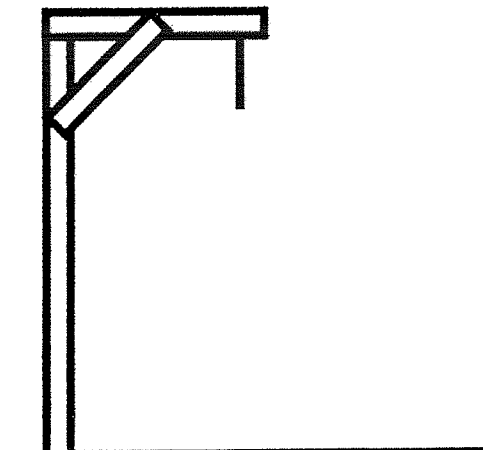
